The Friends of Maryland State Parks are excited to provide a mid-year update. I have also included a few upcoming events for 2026.

Our sixth year of small grant projects are underway. Projects are being completed from the shores of Assateague Island State Park to Deep Creek Lake State Park in western Maryland.

Contributions in 2025 exceeded any previous year since 2014! We provided over \$52,000 in grant awards in February. New for this year included the Ranger Eric Ledbetter History grant (Gathland State Park), the Happy Little Forest Health grant (Garrett State Forest) and public access (Harriet Tubman State Park).
